

TLILIC2001 Licence to operate a forklift truck – Course Description

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| <p><u>Course details</u></p> | <p>When choosing a forklift training course, it is important for you to pick the right one for the skills you require. For example, our course will give you an LF licence (counter balance forklift), which will enable you to drive any forklift (with the exception of an order picker forklift).</p> <p>This course covers the operation of a powered industrial truck equipped with a mast and an elevating load carriage to which is attached a pair of fork arms or other attachment, for licensing purposes.</p> <p>This course requires the operator to be able plan the work, conduct routine checks on the forklift, shift loads in a safe manner, and shut down and secure the equipment after the completion of operations.</p> <p>This unit is based on the National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work.</p> <p>This course is suited to all operators working in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Warehouse - Transport - Construction - Events - Retail |
| <p><u>Training program</u></p> | <p>All students are required to arrive 30min before the course start time for registration and ID check. Any student who is more than 10min late will not be accepted into the course.</p> <p>Students must bring:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Evidence of Identity for 100 points – see full list here ✓ Pen and paper to make notes and complete assessment activities ✓ Comfortable clothing for practical activities which include operating a forklift ✓ Closed shoes must be worn, preferably work boots <p>There are 3 components to this program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Theory training in the classroom ✓ Practical training operating a forklift ✓ Assessment for both knowledge and skills <p>The course is delivered over 2.5 days of training and assessment.</p> |
| <p><u>Granville Training Centre</u></p> | <p>Forklift Training days are Tuesday and Wednesday or Thursday and Friday</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Day one is 8:30am – 4:30pm • Day two is 8:30am – 4:30pm <p>Assessments are typically conducted on a Monday (students must pass day 2 before they can book into an assessment day)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Day three is an assessment day – 7am – 3pm |
| <p><u>Cost & Location</u></p> | <p>The cost for this program is \$400 per person + a SafeWork NSW licence card issuing fee. Current SafeWork NSW fees can be found here.</p> <p>Course delivered in Granville for public.</p> <p>If a student requires a <u>verbal assessment</u>, there will be an additional cost for trainer time & scribing of required questions.</p> <p>This program is available for onsite group bookings, if you have the resources and facilities available for use. TCP TRAINING

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| <p><u>Pre requisites</u></p> | <p>It is important to note that this course requires a level of physical ability to complete practical assessments. If your health or fitness restricts you from performing physical activities associated with this program, you will not be able to complete this course.</p> <p>This course combines plain English, videos, photos, and questioning to ensure all learners are able to have the best possible chance at comprehending the required knowledge and skills. If you believe you will need assistance due to your Language, Literacy or Numeracy skills, please contact our office on 02 9232 1010 to discuss your training needs.</p> <p>All assessments are conducted in English and therefore all students must be able to complete the theory and practical assessments without an interpreter.</p> <p>All students must be 18 years old on the day of assessment.</p> |
| <p><u>Assessment</u></p> | <p>Students will be assessed during the theory and practical training, along with the final assessment day. Assessment will confirm knowledge and skills have been achieved to demonstrate competency across the unit.</p> <p>If a student requires a verbal assessment, please contact our office to arrange.</p> <p>Once you have completed the theory and practical training, you will be notified by the trainer if you're ready to progress onto the assessment day. At this time, you will need to contact TCP Training to book an assessment date. Send an email to info@tcptraining.com or call 02 9232 1010 to book your assessment day.</p> <p>All assessments must be scheduled with a SafeWork NSW Assessor. TCP Training will schedule this on your behalf.</p> <p>Students are offered multiple opportunities to demonstrate knowledge and skills throughout the program. If a student is <u>not successful</u> in completing all assessments satisfactorily, they will need to rebook the course at the full course fee.</p> |
| <p><u>Certification</u></p> | <p>Once a competent mark is awarded, learners will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for TLILIC2001 Licence to operate a forklift truck. This Unit of Competency is Nationally Recognised Training from Transport & Logistics Package.</p> <p>Certificates are emailed to students however hard copy is available for additional fee.</p> <p>Once the SafeWork NSW assessment has been successfully completed, you will receive a SafeWork NSW Notice of Satisfactory Assessment (MSA) which is valid for 60 days. A fee is payable to Australia Post for the licence card which is nationally recognised.</p> |
| <p><u>Recognition of prior learning</u></p> | <p>Students choosing to undertake RPL will need to be sent an RPL guide for their course. To request an RPL guide, please contact our team.</p> <p>In order to be eligible for RPL, the student must demonstrate currency in that particular subject. They must show how they have since applied those skills& that they are current, including any practical skills associated to the program.</p> |
